The lockdown restrictions continue to ease, but the financial impact of Covid 19 is now beginning to bite particularly for those who have lost their job or been furloughed. OWN has tried to plan ahead for this with the Hardship Fund, and this lifeline is now being utilised, eg in the past week for baby essentials. Also during the past week, 10 Foodbank deliveries have been made, assisting around 40 people. We are so grateful for the donations already made to both the Foodbank and the Hardship Fund and we need your continued support if you are able to help. Whenever you go shopping, please try to add a few of the items listed below:

Milk (UHT or powdered) Sugar (500g)

Fruit juice (carton) Tea bags/ Instant coffee

Tinned meat/ Fish Tinned fruit
Soup Pasta sauces

Tinned pulses (lentils, beans, chickpeas) Instant mashed potato

Jam Tinned tomatoes/ vegetables

Cereals Rice pudding

Rice/ Pasta/ Couscous Biscuits or snack bars Sponge pudding (tinned) Ready-made custard
