22/13	To approve final plans for the A14 Legacy Fund/20mph zone scheme Cllr Starling, Clerk and County Cllr Thompson had met with Highways projects officers today via Teams. Cllr Starling outlined the plans.  The 20mph zone cannot be extended to Westwick as it does not meet the criteria. However, following implementation of the Oakington 20mph there may be subsequent opportunities to apply for an extension of the zone.  Westwick enhancements will include replacement of two humps with a full width hump, additional humps near the Busway, refreshed red surfacing, roundels, sharks teeth, replacement of wooden gateways with white plastic gateways and a 40mph buffer zone when entering via Cottenham direction. The 20mph plans need to go to public consultation for 21 days. The aim will be to tie in the Westwick footway resurfacing and complete all works together, hopefully during the last two weeks of the school summer holidays as a road closure will be required.  Cllr Grove arrived at 7.45pm.  Proposed by Cllr Starling that the A14 fund scheme/20 mph zone final plans should be approved. Seconded by Cllr Davidson. RESOLVED unanimously.  RECREATION GROUND/OPEN SPACES MATTERS
